Family Promise Celebrates Effort to Shelter Families

Annual report details program successes and updates

Denver – February 24, 2016 – Family Promise recently released its [2015 Annual Summary](#), recognizing the nonprofit's 19 years of serving families experiencing homelessness.

Last year, we provided emergency shelter and services to 73 families, including 238 individuals – a 15% increase over the previous year. [More than 70 partner congregations](#) facilitated each night of shelter as well as 26,985 meals for program guests, including breakfast, food for lunches, and home-cooked dinners.

"It's exciting to see the community come together to help families in need," said Allie Card, executive director of [Family Promise of Greater Denver](#). "We have more than 1,000 volunteers, and they are the reason we have been able to serve close to 1,200 families since 1997."

Last year, 87% of families improved their financial condition while they were at Family Promise, 70% moved into more stable housing, and 84% of adults were employed or enrolled in a degree program.
